





Dear Mayor DeVore:

This letter is in response to information received from a complainant regarding the possible use of the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) for personal reasons. The complainant alleged Lowell Police Chief Steve Bukala queried his ex-wife and several male acquaintances through LEIN in order to obtain information to use in divorce and custody proceedings.

A check of the LEIN historical records was ordered for any inquiries on Julie Rees, Julie Schomer, Julie Bukala, Shawn Gravlin, or Christopher Rees from March 1, 2012 – March 23, 2017. The results revealed inquiries by the Lowell Police Department that appear to be unconnected to the administration of criminal justice. Copies of the LEIN queries will be provided to the law enforcement agency conducting the criminal investigation upon request.

The City of Lowell is asked to complete the following:

1. Ensure a thorough investigation into the matter is conducted.
2. Provide a status report to LEIN Field Services within 45 days of this correspondence.
3. Respond within 90 days to LEIN Field Services with written documentation including the following:
 - a. Reason for the violation.
 - b. Name of the violator and what disciplinary action was taken, if any. To comply with Act 397 of 1978, commonly known as the Bullard-Plawecki Act, you must advise the employee in writing that the information is being forwarded to LEIN Field Services and the Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Systems Officer (CSO).
 - c. Indicate whether the violator is a certified officer or not.
 - d. Ensure procedures and/or policies are in place to assure violations will not occur in the future.
4. Consult with the county prosecuting attorney if the violation would be a criminal offense under the CJIS Policy Council Act, MCL 28.214, or the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903. The agency must advise LEIN Field Services of the prosecutor's decision. A copy of the CJIS Policy Council Act is enclosed.

Officers and civilian staff who access license plate or driver license records for personal use can be prosecuted for a felony under the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903. This offense would be in addition to any LEIN violation.

FELONY PENALTIES FOR MISUSE DRIVER PRIVACY PROTECTION ACT

MCL 28.214, Section 4, of the CJIS Policy Council Act provides for criminal penalties for misuse of LEIN. In addition, the Michigan Department of State (SOS) cautions law enforcement officers and other LEIN users of felony provisions under state and federal law for misuse of driver and vehicle records:

Whenever LEIN is used for access to driver or vehicle records, the proper use of this information is regulated by a little-known privacy protection law. In 1997, the Michigan Legislature passed a package of privacy bills – Public Acts 99 through 102 – often referred to as the Driver Privacy Protection Act or DPPA. Michigan and other states adopted DPPAs at the urging of the federal government, which established national policy in this area during the mid-1990s.

The federal DPPA, at 18 USC § 2722, says it is unlawful for any person to knowingly obtain or disclose personal information from a motor vehicle record for any use not permitted by statute. Today, before any private person or organization can get a record from a DMV, the requester must complete a form certifying the requester is a permissible user and has a permissible purpose for the request. False certification subjects a requester to prosecution.

Michigan law parallels the federal model. Private sector entities and governmental agencies, including law enforcement officers and other LEIN users, can access Secretary of State files subject to the State's privacy protection plan. Section 208c of the Vehicle Code lists the permissible access purposes under Michigan law and provides that federal, state and local law enforcement agencies may obtain "personal information" from SOS files to carry out agency functions. The term "personal information" is defined to mean information that identifies an individual, including the person's name, address, driver license number, social security number, telephone number, and image.

The Vehicle Code contains express criminal prohibitions to protect motorist privacy. Section 903(1) of the Code says a person who makes a false certification to access personal information is guilty of a felony. The section also says any individual who uses personal information for a reason other than a permissible purpose commits a felony.

SUMMARY: Officers and civilian staff who access license plate or driver license records for personal use can be prosecuted for a DPPA felony. This offense would be in addition to any LEIN misdemeanor (for first violation) that might have been committed under the CJIS Policy Act.

Finally, the DPPA-type felony provisions also appear in the State's Personal ID Card Law, and in the watercraft, ORV and snowmobile chapters of Michigan's Environmental Protection Act.

C.J.I.S. POLICY COUNCIL ACT

Act 163 of 1974

AN ACT to provide for the creation of a criminal justice information systems policy council; to provide for the establishment of policy and promulgation of rules governing access, use, and disclosure of information in criminal justice information systems; to provide for the reimbursement of expenses of council members; and to provide for penalties.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

28.211 Short title.

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "C. J. I. S. policy council act".

28.211a Definitions.

Sec. 1a. As used in this act:

- (a) "Council" means the criminal justice information policy council created in section 2.
- (b) "Nonpublic information" means information to which access, use, or dissemination is restricted by a law or rule of this state or the United States.

28.212 Criminal justice information policy council; creation; membership; terms.

Sec. 2. (1) The criminal justice information policy council is created in the department of state police. The council is composed of the following members:

- (a) The attorney general or his or her designee.
- (b) The secretary of state or his or her designee.
- (c) The director of the department of corrections or his or her designee.
- (d) The chief of the Detroit police department or his or her designee.
- (e) The director of the department of state police or his or her designee.
- (f) Three representatives of the department of state police appointed by the director of the department of state police.
- (g) Three representatives of the Michigan association of chiefs of police appointed by that association.
- (h) Four representatives of the Michigan sheriffs' association appointed by that association.
- (i) Three representatives of the prosecuting attorneys association of Michigan appointed by that association.
- (j) A representative of the Michigan district judges association appointed by that association.
- (k) A representative of the Michigan judges association appointed by that association.
- (l) The state court administrator or his or her designee.
- (m) An individual appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the governor who is employed in or engaged in the private security business.
- (n) An individual appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the governor who represents human services concerns in this state.
- (o) The director of the department of information technology or his or her designee.

(2) The appointed members of the council shall serve 2-year terms and may be reappointed.

28.213 Council; chairperson; election; meeting; compensation; quorum.

Sec. 3. (1) The council, at its first meeting, shall elect from its membership a chairperson, who shall serve for 1 year. An election for chairperson shall be held annually. A chairperson, if reelected, may succeed himself or herself. The council shall meet quarterly during the months of January, April, July, and October or more frequently at the call of the chairperson.

(2) Council members shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to actual expenses incurred during attendance at a regular or special council meeting and in traveling to and from a meeting.

(3) A majority of council members constitute a quorum for conducting the business of the council.

28.213a Council; powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities.

Sec. 3a. (1) The council shall exercise its prescribed powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities independently of the director of the department of state police. The budgeting, procurement, and related management functions of the council shall be performed under the direction and supervision of the director of the department of state police.

(2) The executive secretary of the council shall be appointed by the director of the department of state police subject to the approval of the council.

28.214 Council; powers and duties; fingerprints; disclosure of information; violation; penalty.

Sec. 4. (1) The council shall do all of the following:

(a) Establish policy and promulgate rules governing access, use, and disclosure of information in criminal justice information systems, including the law enforcement information network, the automated fingerprint information system, and other information systems related to criminal justice or law enforcement. The policy and rules shall do all of the following:

(i) Ensure access to information obtained by a federal, state, or local governmental agency to administer criminal justice or enforce any law.

(ii) Ensure access to information provided by the law enforcement information network or the automated fingerprint identification system by a governmental agency engaged in the enforcement of child support laws, child protection laws, or vulnerable adult protection laws.

(iii) Authorize a fire chief of an organized fire department or his or her designee to request and receive information obtained through the law enforcement information network by a law enforcement agency for the following purposes:

(A) A preemployment criminal convictions history.

(B) A preemployment driving record.

(C) Vehicle registration information for vehicles involved in a fire or hazardous materials incident.

(iv) Authorize a public or private school superintendent, principal, or assistant principal to receive vehicle registration information, of a vehicle within 1,000 feet of school property, obtained through the law enforcement information network by a law enforcement agency.

(v) Establish fees for access, use, or dissemination of information from criminal justice information systems.

(b) Review applications for C.J.I.S. access and approve or disapprove the applications and the sites. If an application is disapproved, the applicant shall be notified in writing of the reasons for disapproval.

(c) Establish minimum standards for equipment and software and its installation.

(d) Advise the governor on issues concerning the criminal justice information systems.

(2) A person having direct access to nonpublic information in the information systems governed by this act shall submit a set of fingerprints for comparison with state and federal criminal history records to be approved for access pursuant to the C.J.I.S. security policy. A report of the comparison shall be provided to that person's employer.

(3) A person shall not access, use, or disclose nonpublic information governed under this act for personal use or gain.

(4) The attorney general or his or her designee, a prosecuting attorney, or the court, in a criminal case, may disclose to the defendant or the defendant's attorney of record information pertaining to that defendant that was obtained from the law enforcement information system.

(5) A person shall not disclose information governed under this act in a manner that is not authorized by law or rule.

(6) A person who intentionally violates subsection (3) or (5) is guilty of a crime as follows:

(a) For a first offense, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.

(b) For a second or subsequent offense, the person is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.

28.215 Access to information; powers of council.

Sec. 5. The council may do any of the following:

(a) Authorize access to public record information to enhance public safety or criminal justice, as permitted by law.

(b) Suspend or deny the use of, and access to, information or remove access from an agency if the agency violates policies or promulgated rules of the council.

(c) Suspend or deny direct access to information to an individual who violates this act, policies, or promulgated rules of the council.

APPLICABLE SECTIONS OF STATE STATUTES

CJIS Policy Council Act

The CJIS Policy Council Act, effective February 1, 2006, states a person "shall not access, use, or disclose nonpublic information governed under this act for personal use of gain." It also prohibits "disclosure of information governed under this act in a manner not authorized by law or rule.

A person who violates this subsection for the first offense is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both. For a second or subsequent offense, the person is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.

Driver Privacy Protection Act

The Michigan Department of State (SOS) cautions law enforcement officers and other LEIN users of felony provisions under state and federal law for misuse of driver and vehicle records. Officers and civilian staff who access license plate or driver license records for personal use can be prosecuted for a felony under the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903. This offense would be in addition to any LEIN violation. If the case you are investigating violates MCL 257.903, you should consult with the county prosecutor.

Bullard-Plawecki Employee Right to Know Act

The Bullard-Plawecki Employee Right to Know Act, MCL 423.501 *et seq*, section 6 allows the agency to provide name of the employee/violator and discipline given as long as the agency advises the employee in writing that the information is being forwarded to the Council. As to the disclosure of law enforcement personnel records in general, see reference to FOIA, below.

Freedom of Information Act

The Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) MCL 15.231 *et seq*, Section 13(1) enumerates the applicable exemptions including, but not necessarily limited to, subdivisions (a, d, e, and s).

- (a) Information of a personal nature where the public disclosure of the information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of an individual's privacy.
- (d) Records or information specifically described and exempted from disclosure by statute.

Executive Order 2008-17

Executive Order 2008-17 abolished the CJIS Policy Council. The order stated that "...All of the authority, powers, duties, functions, records, personnel, property, unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, or other funds of the Criminal Justice Information Systems Policy Council are transferred by Type III transfer to the Department of State Police."

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR LEIN VIOLATIONS

- 1) Resolution of violations of the LEIN rules and policies and NCIC rules and policies are subject to progressive LEIN sanctions as follows:
 - a) Notice of the alleged violation sent to the agency head.
 - b) Notice of delinquency sent to the agency head and the entity having budgetary authority over the unit of government. Additional request for the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) and the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) access held in abeyance.
 - c) Limited access to LEIN and AFIS.
 - d) Suspend all access to LEIN and AFIS. The agency shall only be reinstated after review by the CJIS Systems Officer (CSO).

- 2) LEIN Field Services Section Responsibility:
 - a) Receive all complaints of misuse of LEIN and assign a complaint number.
 - b) Review the allegations.
 - c) Request any additional information needed including LEIN traffic.
 - d) Send correspondence on behalf of the CSO to the agency requesting an investigation and response from the agency.
 - e) Review the status of the case at their meetings and take action as necessary.
 - f) Make recommendation to the CJIS Systems Officer (CSO):
 - i) Pending further information from the agency.
 - ii) Invoke next steps of the sanction policy.
 - iii) Close the case.
 - g) Send correspondence to the agency upon closure of the case by the CSO.
 - h) Send correspondence to MCOLES if the CSO deems the case may fall under MCL 28.609b (2).

- 3) Agency Responsibility
 - a) Conduct a thorough investigation upon receipt of written correspondence from the CSO.
 - b) Provide a status report to LEIN Field Services within 45 days of the initial correspondence from the CSO.
 - c) Respond within 90 days with written documentation including the following:
 - i) Reason for the violation.
 - ii) Name of the violator and whether the violator is a certified officer or not.
 - iii) What disciplinary action was taken, if any.
 - iv) What policies and/or directives have been put in place to assure this type of violation will not occur in the future.
 - d) Consult with the prosecuting attorney if there is a possibility that the violation could be a criminal offense under MCL 28.214 or the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903.
 - e) Advise LEIN Field Services of the decision of the prosecutor.

NOTE: The agency may request an extension of the time period for the progressive sanction process by contacting LEIN Field Services.

- 4) CJIS Systems Officer Responsibility:
 - a) Review the recommendation of LEIN Field Services staff regarding the disposition of the complaint.
 - b) Issue a finding of violation or no violation of LEIN.
 - c) Report all violations to the Michigan Legislature or the FBI.

Policy Regarding Criminal Convictions and Access to LEIN

- A) The CSO authorizes the CJIS user agency to approve individual CJIS data access for new employment and/or assignments, using the following criteria:
1. If a conviction for a crime punishable by more than one year exists, the hiring authority in the CJIS user agency shall deny CJIS data access. An employee with such a conviction is exempt from this denial if the conviction and the employment occurred prior to March 1, 2001, and the person has maintained continuous employment with the hiring agency since that time.
 2. If a conviction for the misuse of CJIS data exists, the CJIS user agency shall deny direct access to CJIS data.
 3. If a record of any other kind exists, CJIS data access shall not be granted or allowed to continue until the CJIS user agency reviews the matter to determine if CJIS data access is appropriate.
 4. If the CSO or the CJIS user agency determines that CJIS data access by the person would not be in the public interest, access shall be denied.
- B) Support personnel, contractors, and custodial workers who access physically secure locations or controlled areas shall be subject to a state of residency and national fingerprint-based record check, unless these individuals are escorted by authorized personnel at all times.
- C) The CJIS user agency may ask for a review by the CSO in extenuating circumstances where the severity of the offense and the time that has passed would support a possible variance.

LEIN Field Services SANCTIONS POLICY

Any violation by a user of any of the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) rules could result in denial of access to the LEIN, the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), and the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (NLETS). LEIN Field Services has adopted the following progressive sanction process originally established by the former CJIS Policy Council to enforce these rules while cooperating with agencies to continue to protect the integrity of the system and its users.

Step 1: Notice of the alleged violation is sent to the Agency Head. If the agency head is accused of the alleged violation, notice of the violation will be sent to the Executive Officer of the unit of government, unless the head is an elected official. A response to the CSO must be received A) within 45 days with the proposed resolution or status of the investigation **and** B) any violation must be corrected with documentation to the CSO's satisfaction within 90 days from the date the notice is sent or Step 2 will be initiated.

If an elected official does not respond within the 90-day timeline, the official will be put on notice that, if a response is not received within 30 days, the agency will move to Step 4 of the sanctions process.

Step 2: Notice of delinquency is sent to the Agency Head and the entity having budgetary authority over the unit of government. Any requests for additional LEIN access will be held in abeyance. If no compliance is documented within 30 days, Step 3 will be initiated.

Step 3: Access to LEIN will be limited; Computerized Criminal History inquiries and Administrative Messages will be denied. Notice of delinquency and the denial is sent to the Agency Head, the Executive Officer of the unit of government, the Prosecuting Attorney, and the Chief Judges of the Circuit and District Courts and serviced agencies. If no compliance is documented within 30 days, the matter will be referred to the CSO for initiation of Step 4.

Step 4: The agency shall no longer be permitted to participate in the LEIN. All LEIN access will be removed. The agency shall remain responsible for any unpaid LEIN fees due to this date.

The agency shall not be approved access and can only be reinstated after review and approval by the CJIS System Officer (CSO). The agency may institute a non-terminal user agreement with another agency, but this shall be limited to inquiry capabilities only and excludes access to the criminal history, NCIC III files, and NLETS.

NOTE: Extension to respond to the progressive sanction process may be authorized by the CSO, or its designee, if circumstances warrant such action.



The complaint states the following: "My wives ex husband is a Michigan state police chief. I believe he has used his resources from his job to try and get my wife fired. CHRISTOPHER explained that BUKALA and JULIE are currently going through a custody battle regarding their daughter.

CHRISTOPHER stated that Julie was arrested for drunk driving in August of 2015 by the Kent County Sheriff Department. He also explained that JULIE works for the Kentwood Public Schools System. A couple of weeks ago, an anonymous letter arrived at the Kentwood Public Schools Administration Office; it was JULIE'S drunk driving arrest report. CHRISTOPHER stated that even though the letter was anonymous, he knew that BUKALA had provided JULIE with a copy of the report weeks after her arrest in August of last year.

CHRISTOPHER added that JULIE and BUKALA attended a Kent County F.O.C. mediation on Monday (3-28-16). CHRISTOPHER was not present, but was told by JULIE that BUKALA had provided the Kent County FOC with numerous police reports regarding her contacts with law enforcement over the last few years. CHRISTOPHER questioned how BUKALA would know of these contacts and believed that BUKALA was abusing his powers as the Chief of Police at the Lowell Police Department to obtain these reports.

CARA confirmed that she received a packet of information from BUKALA that contained police reports regarding the police contacts of JULIE. CARA stated that each participant in the "evaluation" receives a packet prior to same. The packet asks the individuals to provide police reports regarding themselves and/or the other half of the "evaluation."

CARA stated that there were approximately ten to twelve police reports provided to her and that all of them appeared to have been printed on 3-9-16. CARA stated that the reports were not redacted. CARA stated that during the "evaluation," BUKALA did not attempt to use his position as police chief to influence her decision.

CONTACT KENT COUNTY 63RD D.C. ADULT PROBATION:

On Monday (4-4-16) I called the Kent County 63rd District Court Adult Probation Department and asked for Angela Bukala. The female receptionist stated that Angela was no longer working for the 63rd D.C. and that she (Angela) had left approximately four to six months prior.

CONTACT KENT COUNTY PROSECUTOR WILLIAM FORSYTH:

On Tuesday (4-5-16) I called Kent County Prosecutor William Forsyth regarding this matter. Prosecutor Forsyth advised that obtaining police reports (whether it was BUKALA or not) was not a crime and that he would take no action on this case if it was forwarded to his office.

Unbeknownst to me, JULIE authored a letter to Liz Canfield (LEIN Field Services); detailing her belief of STEVE'S misuse of LEIN to "harass, humiliate or completely and simply destroy" JULIE'S personal and professional life. In the letter, JULIE includes her previous names – Julie Ann Schomer and Julie Ann Bukala.

From the letter, a check of the LEIN historical records was ordered for any inquiries on Julie Rees, Julie Schomer, Julie Bukala, Shawn Gravlin (former roommate of JULIE'S), or Christopher Rees from March 1, 2012 through March 23, 2017.

As a result of the inquiry, LEIN Field Services sent a letter to the Mayor of Lowell, Mike DeVore. In the letter, it states the following: "The results revealed inquiries by the Lowell Police Department that appear to be unconnected to the administration of criminal justice." The letter was forwarded to Lowell City Manager Michael Burns. On Monday (4-17-17), BURNS placed STEVE on paid administrative leave and contacted MSP 6th District Headquarters to request a criminal investigation.

At approximately 12:00pm on Monday (4-17-17) I contacted LIZ at LEIN Field Services at (517) 284-3103. INTERVIEW MICHAEL BURNS:

At approximately 9:30am on Wednesday (4-19-17) I met with BURNS at the Lowell City Offices. BURNS stated that he has been the Lowell City Manager for approximately seven months. STEVE has confided in BURNS about his divorce from JULIE and their unpleasant current relationship. BURNS explained that STEVE took full custody of their daughter this past summer; in 2016. BURNS also stated that STEVE filed a PPO against JULIE'S current husband; CHRISTOPHER. BURNS stated that, according to STEVE, JULIE is an alcoholic.

BURNS stated that he became aware of this incident on Friday (4-14-17) when he received a call from Lowell City Mayor Mike DeVore. At that time, MIKE read BURNS the letter that was received from LEIN Field Services (attached as an external document). On Saturday (4-15-17), BURNS went to MIKE'S house and picked up the letter. BURNS then took the letter to the Lowell City Attorney's house (Richard A. Wendt of Dickenson / Wright in Grand Rapids) to figure out how to proceed.

BURNS stated that on Monday (4-17-17) he brought STEVEN into DEVORE'S office and let him read the letter. BURNS stated that STEVE was "in shock" and said "you have to suspend me don't you?" BURNS also stated that STEVE said that he did not remember this.

BURNS advised that he placed STEVE on paid administrative leave; that he secured STEVE'S patrol vehicle (unmarked silver Chevy Impala), his department weapon, credentials and department lap top computer.

BURNS stated that he drove STEVE home, sometime between 9:20 – 9:30am. As soon as they pulled out of the city lot, BURNS stated that STEVE said "this is something that can be easily explained, it has to do with issues with me and my ex-wife." BURNS stated that after dropping STEVE off at his house, he (Burns) drove to the MSP 6th District Headquarters and spoke with MSP 6th District Captain Dave Roesler and D/F/Lt. Mike Anderson.

BURNS stated that he had talked to STEVE the previous night (4-18-17) to see how he was doing. BURNS stated that STEVE sent him the following text this date:

- 4-19-17 at 10:04am: "You probably should have Leslie go ahead and suspend my LEIN access. That way she can reported to the state. I don't want this to affect the departments use of LEIN." BURNS responded "Ok." STEVEN then replied "Something to think about today. Prior to November 8, 2013 I was the road patrol Sgt and had patrol / criminal investigation responsibilities. Keep that in mind."

I took a photograph of the above text from BURNS' phone. I have attached it as an external document.

BURNS provided me with a copy of the Lowell City PD policy in regards to computer equipment and LEIN use. The policy has been added to this report as an external document. Subsection C of the policy states "LEIN and all information derived through LEIN shall be limited to official law enforcement purposes ONLY."

BURNS stated that STEVE was hired by the City of Lowell as a part time officer on 11-7-1995. STEVE was promoted to the rank of Sergeant on 7-20-2009. He was promoted to the rank of Chief on 11-8-2013.

BURNS provided me with copies of the Lowell City PD schedule that correspond to the suspected LEIN / SOS queries. This included the following: the departments entire monthly work schedule that corresponds with each suspected query; and a copy of STEVE'S daily activity logs for – the day before, day of and day after each suspect LEIN / SOS query. These have been added to this report as external documents.

While at the police department, I spoke with Administrative Assistant Leslie Heffron. I asked her to query the Lowell City PD report writing database to see if there were reports taken by the LPD that would correspond to the suspected LEIN / SOS queries. LESLIE stated that prior to September of 2014, LPD used the MSP AICS report writing system. LESLIE stated the system was currently down and that she could not access it. I know from personal experience that I could query the AICS system to see if there were any LPD complaints that were possibly connected to the suspect LEIN / SOS queries (See below listed complaint).

BURNS showed me three documents from STEVE'S personnel file. The first was STEVE'S divorce judgement on 6-29-2010 from JULIE; 17th Circuit Court / Honorable Kathleen A. Feeney, case # 09-03463-DMP. The second was from the Kent County Family Division – Circuit Court, 8-25-16, case # 09-003463-DM, a custody order. The third was a memo from retired Chief Barry Getzen; stating that on 11-7-13 and 11-8-13 he conducted an abbreviated background on STEVE and found nothing that would preclude STEVE from being appointed Chief of Police for Lowell PD.

I observed that in 2012 and 2013, STEVE lists on his daily activity logs (surrounding the dates in question) that he is driving patrol vehicle "838." BURNS and LESLIE stated that current LPD patrol vehicle "838" is a 2015 Ford Explorer. LESLIE stated that the patrol vehicle numbers would have stayed the same and the corresponding equipment would be transferred to the new vehicle. BURNS contacted Lowell's IT contractor (Andy Drew – Drew Wireless) and learned that "Lowell PD MDC #2" (the computer that queried the suspect LEIN / SOS) was assigned to Lowell patrol vehicle "836." LPD patrol vehicle "836" is a 2014 Ford Explorer. Andy Drew advised that the current patrol car mobile computers were purchased/ installed in December of 2010. They were changed to Windows 7 and 'solid state drives' were installed in February of 2015. The original hard drives were destroyed (losing any forensic data connected to this investigation).

STEVE'S wife, Angela, was also present during the interview. I recorded the interview using my department issued digital recorder. I later downloaded a copy of the recording onto a DVD-R and entered same into agency property. Below is a summation of the interview.

When STEVE and ANGELA entered the conference room I asked STEVE if his attorney was coming. STEVE replied that his attorney advised him not to speak with me. STEVE said that he was going to speak to me anyways because "you need my statement." I explained to STEVE that he did not have to be here and that he did not have to speak to me; STEVE acknowledged that he understood.

STEVE already knew the purpose of my investigation, but did not know the dates associated with it. I asked STEVE if he wanted to explain the history of his relationship with JULIE. STEVE said that he didn't know what dates I had, but that on several occasions JULIE had been in town (Lowell). STEVE explained "it all starts with the license plate." He went on to explain that when they were married, both license plates were off by one digit and they expired on his birthday (May, 22nd). STEVE stated that after they were divorced, JULIE would routinely drive through town on expired plates. STEVE said that he was still a road patrol sergeant at the time and that he can recall running JULIE'S plate and telling her that her plate was expired. STEVE stated that JULIE would argue with him and tell him that her birthday was in December.

ANGELA spoke up and told STEVE that he may want to provide some history. STEVE stated that JULIE was diagnosed with depression and that she took herself off her medications in 2011 or 2012. STEVE also included that JULIE began to date CHRISTOPHER near the end of 2012 or beginning of 2013. STEVE stated that JULIE would self-medicate with alcohol and that JULIE'S old roommate (Shawn Gravlin) would inform him of same.

STEVE said that JULIE called him around the time that she began dating CHRISTOPHER and asked what could happen to her if she let CHRISTOPHER drive; he did not have a valid driver's license. STEVE explained that she could get charged with allowing a suspending person to operate a vehicle. STEVE explained that he told JULIE to have CHRISTOPHER not drive in Lowell because that would put him in a bad position. STEVE stated that CHRISTOPHER would regularly drive with JULIE in the front passenger seat and [REDACTED] in the back seat.

Again, STEVE mentioned that he was a road patrol sergeant up until November of 2013. STEVE said that he was getting reports of JULIE drinking and driving from an old neighbor, JASON TABER. JASON told STEVE that he saw JULIE and her new boyfriend at a party at the FABIS' house (another old neighbor) and that they were "hammered." STEVE said that this would have been a weekend that JULIE had custody of [REDACTED], a weekend that STEVE would have worked. STEVE explained that he was getting this information and that he was passing it along to the night shift officer, BLAIR KACOS (LPD).

STEVE stated that JULIE was evicted twice in 2013. He added, "that was another time I said your plates expired, she didn't have any money she didn't, she'd blown through \$60,000 worth of 401k money... partying. Uh, so I knew she was out cruising around, she actually pulled in front of me, uh and I called her on her cell phone and said where ya going, why are you in town? She said I'm heading to the Flat River Outreach to see if I can get some assistance. Which didn't make any sense to me because she no longer lived in Lowell, she was living in Caledonia, or Kentwood at the time. Caledonia or Kentwood I don't even remember, she moved around so much."

STEVE said that JULIE was moving around so much in 2013 that he went for custody of [REDACTED]. He said that JULIE was living in a bedroom in a single woman's house and that [REDACTED] was staying with her grandmother; sleeping on a couch at her retirement home. STEVE stated that JULIE was drinking heavily at the time. STEVE explained that PENNI HOMAN, the mother of [REDACTED] best friend, once called STEVE and reported smelling alcohol on JULIE'S breath when she dropped the children off.

STEVE stated that this information kept coming in; that JULIE was out "booze cruising" and that she kept coming out to Lowell to hang out with their old neighbors, JANET and GEORGE FABIS. STEVE added that JULIE would frequent the Lowell area; that she would be driving intoxicated and that her plates would be expired.

STEVE stated the key point that I need to know was that at Lowell PD, when you query a license plate it automatically runs a driver's license status and a driving record. STEVE referred to it as an "automatic drill down" and stated that it is still this way. STEVE added that when you query a plate one time, you get all that information whether you "want it or not." STEVE said that it made it look like multiple queries.

STEVE stated that this is the fourth time that JULIE and CHRISTOPHER have gone after his job. STEVE stated the first attempt involved an email that CHRISTOPHER sent to the city manager (Mark Howe); stating that STEVE was abusing his police powers. STEVE stated that this ultimately led to him getting PPO's on JULIE and CHRISTOPHER in 2014.

STEVE stated that he talked to Chris Becker (Kent County Prosecutor) last year and that Becker informed STEVE that he could "write stalking," but that this would become a "media fire-storm." STEVE said fast forward a year and now he has the media fire-storm that he was trying to avoid. STEVE stated "to say I used LEIN to get child custody, there's no reason, there's nothing for me to gain."

STEVE explained that he currently has custody of [REDACTED]. He said that would have happened no matter what he did for employment. STEVE stated that [REDACTED] while in JULIE'S care and that prompted an independent FOC investigation.

STEVE stated that this was another day in his life with CHRISTOPHER and JULIE. ANGELA spoke up and said that during the above mentioned FOC investigation that CHRISTOPHER would claim that STEVE was abusing his police powers by getting police reports. ANGELA said that they were getting the reports; that she thought CHRISTOPHER must have educated himself on the FOIA process. ANGELA stated that there were numerous reports of domestic violence or of them (Julie and Christopher) drinking from 2014 to 2016. ANGELA stated that [REDACTED] was often present or sometimes the 911 caller. ANGELA said that they were not sh [REDACTED] they made this accusation.

ANGELA stated that she has had these discussions with STEVE. ANGELA said, "I also used to pull LEIN and I'm like we would never do that. I'm like did you pull LEIN on her. He's like....."

[REDACTED], it was always a law enforcement reason I'm like hey you're telling me you did not do this. (STEVE spoke up and added "and they were in town and they were in town.") And he's like personally, no never. Law enforcement, yeah, they're in my community and they're drunk driving, they're really you know without a, proper license plate or license." STEVE finished her sentence by saying "....."

STEVE said that was the bottom line. He added "so, yep, I did run an expired plate, or it was being displayed expired. Does an automatic drill down, that's what happened. How many times, I don't know you have all the dates, um, which I asked you if you'd give those to me cause I can probly explain every single one of them away."

I explained to STEVE that it was partially plate related; that I was not a LEIN "guru" and that a request was sent to LIZ CANFIELD (LEIN Field Services). I explained that LIZ interprets the data and sends it back out to the field. STEVE said "I'm sure it looks horrible" and added "but with the automatic drill down, it's gonna pop up."

I told STEVE that I would go over each LEIN query with him; that there were two incidents in 2012 and three in 2013. I provided STEVE'S daily logs to him and whatever other information he requested to attempt to gain an understanding for each LEIN query.

I asked STEVE if he was telling me that he believed he would have queried JULIE'S plate because she drove passed him. STEVE stated that was his recollection; that if he was running radar at the time that JULIE was a creature of habit. That she travelled the same way in and out of town. STEVE said that JULIE told him that she thought she had some un-paid parking tickets around this time and that she thought her license was suspended. I asked STEVE if he knew what kind of vehicle JULIE was driving back then. STEVE said, "at that time in 2012, it was probably the Mustang."

I told STEVE that JULIE'S plates were not expired on 4-5-12. He responded "nope, because my birthday was in May." He added that JULIE told him that she didn't pay a ticket and he informed her that her license was probably suspended. STEVE said that JULIE sent him a text that she was being stopped by Kentwood PD for speeding and he thought that was around this time. I queried a driving history on JULIE and found a speeding citation from Kentwood PD on 2-15-2011. The query showed that JULIE'S driver's license was suspended on 6-28-12; an FCJ for an equipment violation out of the 63rd D.C. It shows the suspension was terminated on 7-13-12. There were no other suspensions on JULIE'S driving record.

I asked STEVE if he was telling me that each (five) query resulted because JULIE drove passed him while he was in a patrol car. STEVE said that if JULIE didn't drive passed him it was at a child custody exchange. STEVE again mentioned that he was getting information that JULIE was drinking and driving in town (Lowell) and that he would pass this information along to BLAIR KACOS. STEVE said "probably even printed out LEIN" and told BLAIR that this was JULIE'S vehicle. That if BLAIR stopped JULIE and [REDACTED] was in the car, to call him.

STEVE said that he was getting the drinking and driving information from PENNI HOMAN and JASON TABER. ANGELA said that PENNI lived in Caledonia and was STEPHANIE'S best friend's mother. STEVE said that JASON lived on Rolling Creek Dr. and was their former neighbor. STEVE added "so if she wasn't driving in front of me it was alcohol related."

After talking about JULIE'S arrest for drunk driving, I asked if they sent the arrest report to JULIE'S employer; STEVE said that he did not. ANGELA then admitted to doing this. She said that it was a vengeful thing because JULIE had attempted to get harassment charges filed against her just before she mailed the report. ANGELA stated that she enjoyed the instant gratification, that she wouldn't do it again and added that it wasn't illegal.

STEVE said that Thursdays were his nights for visitation. He said there were occasions when JULIE would come out to Lowell to exchange [REDACTED]; either at the police department or at the FABIS' residence. STEVE said that he was racking his brain; that there was a time that JULIE called him when she was stopped by Kentwood Police Department for speeding and he didn't remember if this was the same day or not. STEVE said that if he ran a plate, he never put them on his daily log. He said that he would only put traffic stops on his daily log.

ANGELA spoke up and said that this was around the time when JULIE was fired from her job for being drunk. ANGELA suggested this was a time when STEVE received a tip of JULIE drinking and driving from a community member when JULIE did a child exchange with STEVE.

STEVE looked at his daily log and said that he was running stationary radar. I pointed to a notation on STEVE'S daily log about a meeting with the Chief and asked what that was. STEVE said that was a meeting he had with the Chief but that he always rounded up his times by five minutes. STEVE asked what time he ran her plate; I told him 4:02pm. STEVE said that was right before he conducted a traffic stop "on this lady (pointing to [REDACTED] name on his daily log)."

STEVE said, "I don't know, unless she came into town and I saw her and then I pulled this stop on this lady for speeding 54/35. You're asking me to go back 2012, that's five years ago. I can tell ya if it's a Thursday, like [REDACTED] said that would'a been my a child exchange day which would'a put her in town. Because she was not always, I did not always have to do the pickup. Um, there were times that a, I'm gonna go out and see George and Janet and you can do the pick up there."

I asked STEVE how he normally queried his LEIN, if he used his computer (MCT) or if he called over the radio (to the PD). STEVE said that he normally performed his LEIN queries using the MCT. I informed STEVE that was one thing that caught LIZ'S attention for this query. That STEVE queried JULIE'S license plate, then a few minutes later he had LESLIE query the person he conducted a traffic stop on (

STEVE said that they sometimes had issues with their MCT's crashing. He then said that he knew why he did this. STEVE asked if he wrote a ticket, which I said yes (I later checked his daily further and found out that he did not write this lady a ticket on the date in question). STEVE said that he would have LESLIE run and print the LEIN from the traffic stop so that she could add it to the ticket that went to the court. STEVE said this was when they still had paper tickets and that a driving status and driving record needed to accompany the ticket to the court. It should be noted that I called the 63rd D.C. on Tuesday (5-2-17). I was advised that dating back to 2012, the SOS driving status (35) and driving record (42) were never needed with a Civil Infraction speeding citation.

STEVE said the only thing he could think of was that he received a call that "JULIE was hitting the bottle pretty hard that weekend." STEVE said that Shawn Gravlin was another person that was informing him of this.

STEVE said this was around the time that JULIE cashed in her 401k and that she would be gone for a couple days at a time. STEVE said that JULIE would come out to the MVP Sportsplex in Lowell to meet the FABIS' and that she would go back to their house afterwards. STEVE stated that whether or not JULIE was drinking, he would have received a tip about her alcohol use from that weekend.

I asked STEVE why he would query JULIE'S plate on a Monday if he received a tip about her drinking over the weekend. STEVE responded, "because if she's gonna be coming, if she's gonna be coming back into Lowell, to have that information available. And I would pass it on to the night shirt. You never know when she's gonna be back in. Because she'd be, she would pop into town in, on various days and times."

I informed STEVE that on that day (8-27-12) his daily log showed him at Curtis Cleaners. Then, from 9:00am – 10:00am he listed himself on code "I." I asked STEVE what code "I" meant (the daily log lists "I" as Admin Duties).

ANGELA spoke up and said that this was around the time that JULIE was trying to get a job in Lowell. STEVE added that JULIE was attempting to get a job at Murray Lake Elementary; the summer she lost her prior teaching job.

I again informed STEVE that his query of JULIE came at 8:55am and that his daily log lists him at Curtis Cleaners at 8:30am. STEVE stated, "this is what I get for having a shitty daily." STEVE acknowledged that he had an incomplete daily log and that he only had "10-22" listed after the Cleaners. STEVE stated the "I" meant Admin Duties. He also added that it could be "10-72" which meant "squad room."

I told STEVE that I had to be able to explain a legitimate law enforcement purpose. STEVE again said that he was getting tips about JULIE'S drinking and that he was passing that information along to Officer BLAIR KACOS who worked nights. STEVE added, "I would not have run her just to run her."

ANGELA then asked how JULIE explained being in Lowell on 8-27-12 at 8:55am; because she was the one with these allegations. I explained that it was an allegation by JULIE that triggered a LEIN inquiry in Lansing; that they said that it did not appear to be law enforcement related. STEVE stated "we're talking five queries, if we were talking 50 I would agree with you."

I then explained to STEVE that on 8-27-12, after he queried JULIE'S license plate, that he queried his own license plate. STEVE asked out loud why he would query his own license plate. STEVE said, "I had to be checking for expiration." STEVE asked if JULIE'S plate was expired at the time. I told STEVE that at no time when he queried JULIE'S plate did the records indicate they were expired. STEVE responded that JULIE just never put the tabs on the plate and maybe that was the issue.

STEVE went back to talking about getting tips of JULIE drinking and that she would have an expired license plate displayed. I asked STEVE why he queried his own license plate after querying JULIE'S. STEVE stated that he did not have an explanation for why he queried his own license plate.

I asked STEVE if he could think of a legitimate reason why he queried his own plate before querying JULIE'S. STEVE said "I know they were off by one digit." STEVE stated that his plate was "2JEE09" and that JULIE'S was "2JEE10." He said he still remembered JULIE'S because he obtained the plates originally. I told STEVE that I could understand if he "fat fingered" JULIE'S first, but that he already queried hers and the information came back. STEVE again said that he did not know why he queried his own license plate.

2-26-13 at 9:23am – a Tuesday:

STEVE explained that JULIE would have been living in Kentwood during this time. STEVE'S daily log shows that he was on "E (code)" from 8:30am to 9:30am at "63rd." After looking at his daily log, STEVE said that he was probably running warrant paperwork to the 63rd District Court that day. To be noted, the 63rd D.C. is located at 1950 E. Beltline Ave N.E. in Grand Rapids.

STEVE stated that he would have included drive time on his daily log. STEVE said that he couldn't give me an explanation for that one because he was going to and from court in an hour. I asked STEVE if he could think of a legitimate law enforcement reason why he would query JULIE'S license plate in this instance. STEVE said that unless JULIE was at the 63rd D.C. he did not know. STEVE said that if JULIE was at the 63rd D.C., he would be curious why she was there.

STEVE explained that he was still a road patrol sergeant at this time and that he would have more concerns if he was querying JULIE'S license plate as the chief. Then, he said, he would have no legitimate reason to query her other than the PPO.

I again explained to STEVE that he queried JULIE'S plate on 2-26-13 at 9:23am; that at 8:52am he was querying his own license plate again. ANGELA asked "on the same date?" I then informed them that second's before querying JULIE'S license plate, that he ran a version of JULIE'S license plate with an extra "J" (2JJEE10). STEVE responded, "If there was an extra J in there why would I be running it." After a pause, he said that he didn't know. STEVE asked if this was the same day that his daily log lists him at the 63rd DC (it was). STEVE said "so I'm obviously moving so if I admit to this I'm doing a violation of policy because I activated the MCT while the car was moving, and if I'm coming back from the court Flat River Outreach is on the way back into Lowell.....(Angela spoke up and said "you always round up five minutes")....I always round up, always, whether it's a five or zero."

I asked STEVE why he ran his own plate. STEVE stated "I don't know, I, I have no idea; stupidity." I asked STEVE if it was for a law enforcement purpose. He stated "My own? Obviously not. I'm running my own plate, I know my plate's valid." I asked STEVE then what about querying JULIE'S around that time. STEVE said that he routinely queried plates while patrolling and that JULIE was probably on her way to Flat River Outreach. STEVE said that he knows how this looks. STEVE acknowledged that he knew that he could not use LEIN to check if his own license plates were expired.

I asked STEVE if he ever thought about documenting this on his daily log. That if he did see JULIE and query her, to document it to have his bases covered. STEVE said "hindsight yeah, I probably should of."

STEVE added this date is [REDACTED] birthday also. STEVE said "also what it comes down to is if I have information with her drinking and driving I should'a had another officer run the plate, and all that. Rather than me, because it looks like I'm doing it for an illegitimate purpose."

STEVE said the problem with Lowell is that there is only one officer working at a time; except on the weekends. STEVE said that it comes down to his word versus JULIE'S word.

I explained to STEVE that on this date (6-3-13) that he had LESLIE query LEIN for him at 7:13am. Then he queries JULIE'S license plate at 8:10am; then the remainder of his LEIN is run through LESLIE. I said this was another thing that made LIZ suspicious of these LEIN queries.

ANGELA spoke up; she asked STEVE if he didn't query JULIE through LESLIE because he did not want JULIE'S problems to become public in the city. I explained that from Lansing's perspective, it looked like he did not want his secretary knowing that he's querying his ex-wife's license plate. STEVE said that he would need to see the LEIN that LESLIE "ran" in order to answer that because he didn't see anything on his daily log. STEVE explained that it could have been gun permits and that maybe his name wasn't taken out of her (Leslie's) query. I told STEVE that he knew that he was responsible for the "operator" and the "for"; he said that he knew this.

After learning that one of the subjects that LESLIE queried for him was [REDACTED], STEVE said that he was a "frequent flyer." That MICHAEL was a parolee who is in prison now. STEVE explained that he probably had LESLIE run a warrant check on MICHAEL as he drove by; that he couldn't pull up that information quickly so he had LESLIE do it. STEVE again said that he didn't know. That JULIE could have driven passed him, followed by MICHAEL; that he is going to go after MICHAEL instead of JULIE. I asked STEVE what he would say if JULIE was, hypothetically, out of town on these days. STEVE said that it would then be alcohol related tips.

6-8-13 at 1:35pm – a Saturday:

STEVE explained that JULIE was probably out to the FABIS' for a playdate with the kids. From looking at his daily log, STEVE said that he ate lunch from 12:30pm to 1:00pm and that he was on mobile patrol until 2:30pm when he had to go to the police department to confirm a warrant.

ANGELA spoke up and said that this was around the time of the tip from PENNI; the 'Mike's Hard Lemonade' tips about JULIE driving with open intoxicants.

I clarified with STEVE that he was saying his justifications were: for license plate expiration, that she was driving by him while he's working or that he received an alcohol related tip; he said yes.

I asked STEVE if there was a place in the police department where these tips were posted. STEVE said that they had a "current materials" book, but the information from 2012 and 2013 did not exist anymore. STEVE said that BLAIR KACOS was his night-shift relief officer and that BLAIR knew a lot about what was going on at the time. STEVE said that he remembers passing on tips to him; about JULIE'S drinking and driving.

STEVE mentioned that PENNI HOMAN called him about JULIE'S drinking. PENNI told STEVE that no one wanted their kids around JULIE because of the alcohol and the lifestyle she was living. STEVE stated that PENNI testified about this at their custody hearing.

STEVE said that he passed PENNI HOMAN and JASON TABER'S information along to the night shift; but he did not document any of this information.

I asked STEVE if he queried JULIE'S license plate for any other reason other than a law enforcement purpose; he said no. STEVE said that there was nothing for him to gain by doing it.

STEVE said to take JULIE'S name out of it and to insert "John Smith;" did it look legitimate. STEVE said "my answer is yes." STEVE said that all he can say is that it was driving related, tip related or alcohol related.

STEVE said that he would have to own up to querying his own license plate. That if he got "jammed up" for it, he would take his punishment for it. STEVE said "I'll admit, running my own plate, stupid. Or, I have no explanation for it and if I get dinged for that I get dinged for that."

CONTACT WITH LOWELL CITY MANAGER MICHAEL BURNS:

At approximately 12:50pm on Tuesday (5-2-17) I spoke with BURNS. BURNS stated that he talked to STEVE the previous day at approximately 4:00pm. BURNS stated that he called STEVE in regards to unrelated police department matters. BURNS stated that he asked STEVE how the interview (with me) went.

BURNS stated that STEVE told him that there were five LEIN queries: That one time he queried JULIE'S license plate to see if it was still in his (Steve's) name; that two of the queries were for law enforcement purposes and that one or two queries he could not recall or could not explain.

STEVE told BURNS that he forget to tell me about checking to see if JULIE'S plate was still in his name.

RE-CONTACT CHRISTOPHER AND JULIE REES:

At approximately 5:55pm on Tuesday (5-2-17) I called JULIE. I explained to her that since I had already interviewed STEVE, I would inform her of the suspect dates to see if she could verify her whereabouts around same.

JULIE explained that she did house-sit for the FABIS' the weekend of September 27-29 in 2013.

JULIE explained that for the 4-5-12 (4:02pm) query, she was still employed at the Vanguard Charter Academy and dismissal was at 3:15pm (in Wyoming). JULIE stated that she would typically not leave Vanguard until approximately 3:45pm. JULIE stated that this would have been during the school year and that STEVE always came her way to pick up [REDACTED]. JULIE stated that she never went to Lowell to pick up / drop off [REDACTED]. She also added that she never went out to the FABIS' for any party after her and STEVE were divorced.

BLAIR stated that he never met JULIE. He added that STEVE and JULIE were going through their divorce when he (Blair) was hired at Lowell. BLAIR stated that it seemed like a "nasty divorce." BLAIR stated that it was his impression that JULIE had issues with drinking and possibly drugs. BLAIR stated his information came from STEVE. BLAIR also mentioned that STEVE used to talk about JULIE not being mentally stable.

I asked BLAIR if STEVE passed any information along to him while he was working at Lowell. BLAIR stated that STEVE did not pass any information along to him while he was at Lowell. BLAIR said that STEVE did pass information along to him while he was working at the Kentwood Police Department. BLAIR stated that he worked at Kentwood PD from September of 2013 until June of 2016.

BLAIR stated that around May of 2014, STEVE passed along some information that JULIE was driving around in a silver Mustang with no driver's license. STEVE told BLAIR that JULIE might be in the Kentwood area. BLAIR stated that he never ran into JULIE and that he never looked for her; he had "bigger things to do."

BLAIR stated that he talked to STEVE a couple of weeks ago about the possibility of secondary employment. BLAIR stated he withdrew after this investigation became public. According to BLAIR, STEVE told him that this investigation was the fourth time his ex-wife was going after him and that she was accusing him of a LEIN violation.

I asked BLAIR if he would query his ex-wife in LEIN given similar circumstances. BLAIR stated "me, no. I'm overly cautious because I don't want to be associated with drama." INTERVIEW GEORGE FABIS:

Dear Ms. Canfield,

I am writing you this letter with hopes that I can find some closure into the suspicions that I have had for the past several years regarding my ex-husband's (Steven James Bukala) misuse of LEIN to harass, humiliate or completely and simply destroy both my personal and professional life.

I believe a pattern of this behavior began in 2010. I was residing in a condominium and received an unmarked envelope in my postal mailbox. Inside the envelope was a sheet of paper with a mugshot and information regarding a domestic arrest on the man (Shawn Allan Gravlin) I was then dating. When I confronted Steve, he denied he had anything to do with this.

In October of 2012, I began dating my now husband Christopher Adam Rees. At this time I received a derogatory email from Steve stating something about my "felony boyfriend." I am not sure how he obtained this information about Chris.

In February of 2015, Chris and I went to the Family Tavern in Caledonia, MI. Three men approached my husband and me while we were sitting in a booth and "jumped" Chris. Chris called the Kent County Sheriff's department and a Deputy came to the bar. All parties involved agreed to not press any charges. This is what I am most concerned about how Steve would know about this incident as there were no charges and just a written report.

In March of 2016, the above Family Tavern incident was given to our Friend of the Court Assessor as Steve was once again attempting to gain physical custody of our daughter. Not only did he give her this report but all reports of any encounters I had with the police. These reports included: three domestic calls (one where I was arrested, one where Chris was arrested, and another where there was no arrest) and my DUI. He somehow knew of all these incidents.

In March of 2016 (just a few days before we met with our assessor) I was called to meet with a gentleman in the Human Resources Department with Kentwood Public Schools (for whom I was working) to discuss an unmarked envelope that had been sent to them. The envelope contained the police report of my DUI. I don't have the proof but I know this was done by Steve with the intent to have me fired from my job with KPS. I do have a copy of the envelope and it matches the handwriting of his current wife. I am willing to pay for a handwriting analysis if need be. Chris and I understand that this was not done underhandedly. We have been sent the paperwork from FOIA stating that Angela Bukala was the one who requested that police report. Please note that this is the ONLY report requested to FOIA. This is why I am concerned to how he knows about everything else I have shared with you.

In conclusion, I do feel I have been harassed and humiliated, and yes; even lost physical custody of my daughter because he was able to present information by using his position in law enforcement inappropriately to obtain records that others would not know about. I feel violated. I have admitted to and have been accountable to the mistakes I have made. I will no longer let these mistakes define who I am today.

FOC has received a copy of the order dated 4/2/14, however I am still unable to process your complaint alleging denial of your weekend during the children's spring break... see highlighted portion of the enclosed brochure.

Your court order lacks sufficient detail for Friend of the Court to process your complaint as a specific violation. One or more of the following checked items are missing from your court order:

- Hours: The specific time when parenting time is to begin or end.
- Day: The specific day of the week when parenting time is to begin or end.
- Holidays: The actual list of holidays to be followed; and/or the assignment of holidays to each parent in odd/even years.
- Extended Parenting Time: The specific start/end day or dates for extended parenting time during the summer or during school breaks. **Your court order does not say whether or not the weekend schedule is included or excluded from the school break. There is no standing policy on this issue that can be enforced in the court order is silent.**
- Location: The specific location for parenting time exchanges to take place when the court order calls for the parents to meet for exchanges. [Note: When your court order is silent about an exchange location, the exchanges are to occur at the parental residence.]
- Other:

If you have attempted to work out an agreement with the other parent regarding the subject(s) described above, but you have not succeeded in reaching a mutual agreement, you may request that Friend of the Court schedule a co-parent session to assist you in clarifying or defining the terms of your parenting time order. Both parents would be invited to participate, and if an agreement is reached a stipulation and order can be prepared. If parents do not reach an agreement, a recommendation and proposed order *may* be submitted to the Court by the facilitator. Both parents would still have the right to file an objection to any proposal and have a hearing before a Referee/Judge before a proposed order would become an Order of the Court. A request to schedule a co-parent session must be submitted to Friend of the Court within 21 days (see form enclosed).

Another option would be to submit a written request for mediation to Friend of the Court if you believe the two of you can negotiate and agree on the undefined aspects of your

This letter is in response to information received from a complainant regarding the possible use of the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) for personal reasons. The complainant alleged Lowell Police Chief Steve Bukala queried his ex-wife and several male acquaintances through LEIN in order to obtain information to use in divorce and custody proceedings.

A check of the LEIN historical records was ordered for any inquiries on Julie Rees, Julie Schomer, Julie Bukala, Shawn Gravlin, or Christopher Rees from March 1, 2012 – March 23, 2017. The results revealed inquiries by the Lowell Police Department that appear to be unconnected to the administration of criminal justice. Copies of the LEIN queries will be provided to the law enforcement agency conducting the criminal investigation upon request.

The City of Lowell is asked to complete the following:

1. Ensure a thorough investigation into the matter is conducted.
2. Provide a status report to LEIN Field Services within 45 days of this correspondence.
3. Respond within 90 days to LEIN Field Services with written documentation including the following:
 - a. Reason for the violation.
 - b. Name of the violator and what disciplinary action was taken, if any. To comply with Act 397 of 1978, commonly known as the Bullard-Plawecki Act, you must advise the employee in writing that the information is being forwarded to LEIN Field Services and the Criminal Justice Information Services (CJIS) Systems Officer (CSO).
 - c. Indicate whether the violator is a certified officer or not.
 - d. Ensure procedures and/or policies are in place to assure violations will not occur in the future.
4. Consult with the county prosecuting attorney if the violation would be a criminal offense under the CJIS Policy Council Act, MCL 28.214, or the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903. The agency must advise LEIN Field Services of the prosecutor's decision. A copy of the CJIS Policy Council Act is enclosed.

Officers and civilian staff who access license plate or driver license records for personal use can be prosecuted for a felony under the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903. This offense would be in addition to any LEIN violation.

The Federal CJIS Security Policy requires a review of all possible violations of LEIN or the National Crime Information Center. Please refer to the case number located in the reference section of this letter in all future correspondence. If necessary, you may request an extension of the time period to avoid progressive sanctions.

ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES FOR LEIN VIOLATIONS

- 1) Resolution of violations of the LEIN rules and policies and NCIC rules and policies are subject to progressive LEIN sanctions as follows:
 - a) Notice of the alleged violation sent to the agency head.
 - b) Notice of delinquency sent to the agency head and the entity having budgetary authority over the unit of government. Additional request for the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) and the Automated Fingerprint Identification System (AFIS) access held in abeyance.
 - c) Limited access to LEIN and AFIS.
 - d) Suspend all access to LEIN and AFIS. The agency shall only be reinstated after review by the CJIS Systems Officer (CSO).

- 2) LEIN Field Services Section Responsibility:
 - a) Receive all complaints of misuse of LEIN and assign a complaint number.
 - b) Review the allegations.
 - c) Request any additional information needed including LEIN traffic.
 - d) Send correspondence on behalf of the CSO to the agency requesting an investigation and response from the agency.
 - e) Review the status of the case at their meetings and take action as necessary.
 - f) Make recommendation to the CJIS Systems Officer (CSO):
 - i) Pending further information from the agency.
 - ii) Invoke next steps of the sanction policy.
 - iii) Close the case.
 - g) Send correspondence to the agency upon closure of the case by the CSO.
 - h) Send correspondence to MCOLES if the CSO deems the case may fall under MCL 28.609b (2).

- 3) Agency Responsibility
 - a) Conduct a thorough investigation upon receipt of written correspondence from the CSO.
 - b) Provide a status report to LEIN Field Services within 45 days of the initial correspondence from the CSO.
 - c) Respond within 90 days with written documentation including the following:
 - i) Reason for the violation.
 - ii) Name of the violator and whether the violator is a certified officer or not.
 - iii) What disciplinary action was taken, if any.
 - iv) What policies and/or directives have been put in place to assure this type of violation will not occur in the future.
 - d) Consult with the prosecuting attorney if there is a possibility that the violation could be a criminal offense under MCL 28.214 or the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903.
 - e) Advise LEIN Field Services of the decision of the prosecutor.

NOTE: The agency may request an extension of the time period for the progressive sanction process by contacting LEIN Field Services.

- 4) CJIS Systems Officer Responsibility:
 - a) Review the recommendation of LEIN Field Services staff regarding the disposition of the complaint.
 - b) Issue a finding of violation or no violation of LEIN.
 - c) Report all violations to the Michigan Legislature or the FBI.

SANCTIONS POLICY

Any violation by a user of any of the Law Enforcement Information Network (LEIN) rules could result in denial of access to the LEIN, the National Crime Information Center (NCIC), and the National Law Enforcement Telecommunications System (NLETS). LEIN Field Services has adopted the following progressive sanction process originally established by the former CJIS Policy Council to enforce these rules while cooperating with agencies to continue to protect the integrity of the system and its users.

Step 1: Notice of the alleged violation is sent to the Agency Head. If the agency head is accused of the alleged violation, notice of the violation will be sent to the Executive Officer of the unit of government, unless the head is an elected official. A response to the CSO must be received A) within 45 days with the proposed resolution or status of the investigation and B) any violation must be corrected with documentation to the CSO's satisfaction within 90 days from the date the notice is sent or Step 2 will be initiated.

If an elected official does not respond within the 90-day timeline, the official will be put on notice that, if a response is not received within 30 days, the agency will move to Step 4 of the sanctions process.

Step 2: Notice of delinquency is sent to the Agency Head and the entity having budgetary authority over the unit of government. Any requests for additional LEIN access will be held in abeyance. If no compliance is documented within 30 days, Step 3 will be initiated.

Step 3: Access to LEIN will be limited; Computerized Criminal History inquiries and Administrative Messages will be denied. Notice of delinquency and the denial is sent to the Agency Head, the Executive Officer of the unit of government, the Prosecuting Attorney, and the Chief Judges of the Circuit and District Courts and serviced agencies. If no compliance is documented within 30 days, the matter will be referred to the CSO for initiation of Step 4.

Step 4: The agency shall no longer be permitted to participate in the LEIN. All LEIN access will be removed. The agency shall remain responsible for any unpaid LEIN fees due to this date.

The agency shall not be approved access and can only be reinstated after review and approval by the CJIS System Officer (CSO). The agency may institute a non-terminal user agreement with another agency, but this shall be limited to inquiry capabilities only and excludes access to the criminal history, NCIC III files, and NLETS.

NOTE: Extension to respond to the progressive sanction process may be authorized by the CSO, or its designee, if circumstances warrant such action.

C.J.I.S. POLICY COUNCIL ACT

Act 163 of 1974

AN ACT to provide for the creation of a criminal justice information systems policy council; to provide for

the establishment of policy and promulgation of rules governing access, use, and disclosure of information in criminal justice information systems; to provide for the reimbursement of expenses of council members; and to provide for penalties.

The People of the State of Michigan enact:

28.211 Short title.

Sec. 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the "C.J.I.S. policy council act".

28.211a Definitions.

Sec. 1a. As used in this act:

(a) "Council" means the criminal justice information policy council created in section 2.

(b) "Nonpublic information" means information to which access, use, or dissemination is restricted by a law or rule of this state or the United States.

28.212 Criminal justice information policy council; creation; membership; terms.

Sec. 2. (1) The criminal justice information policy council is created in the department of state police. The council is composed of the following members:

(a) The attorney general or his or her designee.

(b) The secretary of state or his or her designee.

(c) The director of the department of corrections or his or her designee.

(d) The chief of the Detroit police department or his or her designee.

(e) The director of the department of state police or his or her designee.

(f) Three representatives of the department of state police appointed by the director of the department of state police.

(g) Three representatives of the Michigan association of chiefs of police appointed by that association.

(h) Four representatives of the Michigan sheriffs' association appointed by that association.

(i) Three representatives of the prosecuting attorneys association of Michigan appointed by that association.

(j) A representative of the Michigan district judges association appointed by that association.

(k) A representative of the Michigan judges association appointed by that association.

(l) The state court administrator or his or her designee.

(m) An individual appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the governor who is employed in or engaged in the private security business.

(n) An individual appointed by and serving at the pleasure of the governor who represents human services concerns in this state.

(o) The director of the department of information technology or his or her designee.

(2) The appointed members of the council shall serve 2-year terms and may be reappointed.

28.213 Council; chairperson; election; meeting; compensation; quorum.

Sec. 3. (1) The council, at its first meeting, shall elect from its membership a chairperson, who shall serve for 1 year. An election for chairperson shall be held annually. A chairperson, if reelected, may succeed himself or herself. The council shall meet quarterly during the months of January, April, July, and October or more frequently at the call of the chairperson.

(2) Council members shall serve without compensation, but are entitled to actual expenses incurred during attendance at a regular or special council meeting and in traveling to and from a meeting.

(3) A majority of council members constitute a quorum for conducting the business of the council.

28.213a Council; powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities.

Sec. 3a. (1) The council shall exercise its prescribed powers, duties, functions, and responsibilities independently of the director of the department of state police. The budgeting, procurement, and related management functions of the council shall be performed under the direction and supervision of the director of the department of state police.

(2) The executive secretary of the council shall be appointed by the director of the department of state police subject to the approval of the council.

28.214 Council; powers and duties; fingerprints; disclosure of information; violation; penalty.

Sec. 4. (1) The council shall do all of the following:

(a) Establish policy and promulgate rules governing access, use, and disclosure of information in criminal justice information systems, including the law enforcement information network, the automated fingerprint information system, and other information systems related to criminal justice or law enforcement. The policy and rules shall do all of the following:

- (i) Ensure access to information obtained by a federal, state, or local governmental agency to administer criminal justice or enforce any law.
- (ii) Ensure access to information provided by the law enforcement information network or the automated fingerprint identification system by a governmental agency engaged in the enforcement of child support laws, child protection laws, or vulnerable adult protection laws.
- (iii) Authorize a fire chief of an organized fire department or his or her designee to request and receive information obtained through the law enforcement information network by a law enforcement agency for the following purposes:
 - (A) A preemployment criminal convictions history.
 - (B) A preemployment driving record.
 - (C) Vehicle registration information for vehicles involved in a fire or hazardous materials incident.
- (iv) Authorize a public or private school superintendent, principal, or assistant principal to receive vehicle registration information, of a vehicle within 1,000 feet of school property, obtained through the law enforcement information network by a law enforcement agency.
- (v) Establish fees for access, use, or dissemination of information from criminal justice information systems.

(b) Review applications for C.J.I.S. access and approve or disapprove the applications and the sites. If an application is disapproved, the applicant shall be notified in writing of the reasons for disapproval.

(c) Establish minimum standards for equipment and software and its installation.

(d) Advise the governor on issues concerning the criminal justice information systems.

(2) A person having direct access to nonpublic information in the information systems governed by this act shall submit a set of fingerprints for comparison with state and federal criminal history records to be approved for access pursuant to the C.J.I.S. security policy. A report of the comparison shall be provided to that person's employer.

(3) A person shall not access, use, or disclose nonpublic information governed under this act for personal use or gain.

(4) The attorney general or his or her designee, a prosecuting attorney, or the court, in a criminal case, may disclose to the defendant or the defendant's attorney of record information pertaining to that defendant that was obtained from the law enforcement information system.

(5) A person shall not disclose information governed under this act in a manner that is not authorized by law or rule.

(6) A person who intentionally violates subsection (3) or (5) is guilty of a crime as follows:

(a) For a first offense, the person is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both.

(b) For a second or subsequent offense, the person is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.

FELONY PENALTIES FOR MISUSE DRIVER PRIVACY PROTECTION ACT

MCL 28.214, Section 4, of the CJIS Policy Council Act provides for criminal penalties for misuse of LEIN. In addition, the Michigan Department of State (SOS) cautions law enforcement officers and other LEIN users of felony provisions under state and federal law for misuse of driver and vehicle records:

Whenever LEIN is used for access to driver or vehicle records, the proper use of this information is regulated by a little-known privacy protection law. In 1997, the Michigan Legislature passed a package of privacy bills – Public Acts 99 through 102 – often referred to as the Driver Privacy Protection Act or DPPA. Michigan and other states adopted DPPAs at the urging of the federal government, which established national policy in this area during the mid-1990s.

The federal DPPA, at 18 USC § 2722, says it is unlawful for any person to knowingly obtain or disclose personal information from a motor vehicle record for any use not permitted by statute. Today, before any private person or organization can get a record from a DMV, the requester must complete a form certifying the requester is a permissible user and has a permissible purpose for the request. False certification subjects a requester to prosecution.

Michigan law parallels the federal model. Private sector entities and governmental agencies, including law enforcement officers and other LEIN users, can access Secretary of State files subject to the State's privacy protection plan. Section 208c of the Vehicle Code lists the permissible access purposes under Michigan law and provides that federal, state and local law enforcement agencies may obtain "personal information" from SOS files to carry out agency functions. The term "personal information" is defined to mean information that identifies an individual, including the person's name, address, driver license number, social security number, telephone number, and image.

The Vehicle Code contains express criminal prohibitions to protect motorist privacy. Section 903(1) of the Code says a person who makes a false certification to access personal information is guilty of a felony. The section also says any individual who uses personal information for a reason other than a permissible purpose commits a felony.

SUMMARY: Officers and civilian staff who access license plate or driver license records for personal use can be prosecuted for a DPPA felony. This offense would be in addition to any LEIN misdemeanor (for first violation) that might have been committed under the CJIS Policy Act.

Finally, the DPPA-type felony provisions also appear in the State's Personal ID Card Law, and in the watercraft, ORV and snowmobile chapters of Michigan's Environmental Protection Act.

APPLICABLE SECTIONS OF STATE STATUTES

CJIS Policy Council Act

The CJIS Policy Council Act, effective February 1, 2006, states a person "shall not access, use, or disclose nonpublic information governed under this act for personal use of gain." It also prohibits "disclosure of information governed under this act in a manner not authorized by law or rule.

A person who violates this subsection for the first offense is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or a fine of not more than \$500.00, or both. For a second or subsequent offense, the person is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$2,000.00, or both.

Driver Privacy Protection Act

The Michigan Department of State (SOS) cautions law enforcement officers and other LEIN users of felony provisions under state and federal law for misuse of driver and vehicle records. Officers and civilian staff who access license plate or driver license records for personal use can be prosecuted for a felony under the Driver Privacy Protection Act, MCL 257.903. This offense would be in addition to any LEIN violation. If the case you are investigating violates MCL 257.903, you should consult with the county prosecutor.

Bullard-Plawecki Employee Right to Know Act

The Bullard-Plawecki Employee Right to Know Act, MCL 423.501 *et seq*, section 6 allows the agency to provide name of the employee/violator and discipline given as long as the agency advises the employee in writing that the information is being forwarded to the Council. As to the disclosure of law enforcement personnel records in general, see reference to FOIA, below.

Freedom of Information Act

The Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) MCL 15.231 *et seq*, Section 13(1) enumerates the applicable exemptions including, but not necessarily limited to, subdivisions (a, d, e, and s).

- (a) Information of a personal nature where the public disclosure of the information would constitute a clearly unwarranted invasion of an individual's privacy.
- (d) Records or information specifically described and exempted from disclosure by statute.

Executive Order 2008-17

Executive Order 2008-17 abolished the CJIS Policy Council. The order stated that "...All of the authority, powers, duties, functions, records, personnel, property, unexpended balances of appropriations, allocations, or other funds of the Criminal Justice Information Systems Policy Council are transferred by Type III transfer to the Department of State Police."

Policy Regarding Criminal Convictions and Access to LEIN

- A) The CSO authorizes the CJIS user agency to approve individual CJIS data access for new employment and/or assignments, using the following criteria:
1. If a conviction for a crime punishable by more than one year exists, the hiring authority in the CJIS user agency shall deny CJIS data access. An employee with such a conviction is exempt from this denial if the conviction and the employment occurred prior to March 1, 2001, and the person has maintained continuous employment with the hiring agency since that time.
 2. If a conviction for the misuse of CJIS data exists, the CJIS user agency shall deny direct access to CJIS data.
 3. If a record of any other kind exists, CJIS data access shall not be granted or allowed to continue until the CJIS user agency reviews the matter to determine if CJIS data access is appropriate.
 4. If the CSO or the CJIS user agency determines that CJIS data access by the person would not be in the public interest, access shall be denied.
- B) Support personnel, contractors, and custodial workers who access physically secure locations or controlled areas shall be subject to a state of residency and national fingerprint-based record check, unless these individuals are escorted by authorized personnel at all times.
- C) The CJIS user agency may ask for a review by the CSO in extenuating circumstances where the severity of the offense and the time that has passed would support a possible variance.

POLICIES and PROCEDURES

May 2, 2011

SUBJECT: Computer Equipment/LEIN

To: Members of the Department

I. COMPUTER ACCESS

- A. Access to the department's computers shall be limited to employees only unless authorized in writing by the Chief of Police or his designee.
- B. For certain applications, employees are assigned passwords.
 - 1. Employees will use their own password to access these applications.
 - 2. Employees will not share or reveal their passwords to anyone.
 - 3. No employee will use a password assigned to another employee.
 - 4. After the application use is completed, employees will close out the password-guarded application before leaving the workstation.
- C. Employees may not use personally owned software in the workplace on department equipment.
- D. All software shall be used in accordance with the terms of the license agreement and all applicable copyright laws.
 - 1. Use of private or counterfeit software on department equipment is prohibited.
 - 2. Employees may not make copies of department owned software other than for accepted backup purposes, etc.

II. INTERNET ACCESS & USAGE

- A. The Internet is a useful research tool that employees may access through City of Lowell and Lowell Police Department connections.
- B. The Internet shall not be used to access or view obscene or sexually explicit material or any material or sites that may be offensive to others.
 - 1. An exception is made for sites accessed as part of an official police criminal or internal administrative investigation; ONLY with prior approval by the Chief of Police or his designee.
- C. The Internet shall not be used for any illegal purpose.
- D. The Internet shall not be used by any personnel to foster personal gain or to conduct personal business for profit.

III. ELECTRONIC MAIL

- A. E-mail accounts are provided for all full-time employees.
- B. Employees will check department e-mail with regularity.
- C. No inappropriate e-mail messages may be sent from department computers.
- D. E-mail may not be used to send threatening, harassing or offensive messages.
- E. There is no expectation to privacy when using the city or department networks to send or receive e-mail messages. All e-mail messages sent or received through the city or department system should be considered public record and are subject to release and/or discovery to outside sources such as the media, courts, or public via FOIA requests or subpoena.
 1. The network system is backed up on a regular basis. E-mail messages sent or received through the system will be retained for a lengthy period of time even when deleted from the device it was received or sent on.
 2. The Chief of Police or his designee, system administrator or other authorized person may access employee e-mail and files contained on any city or department owned device or system.
 - a. For routine maintenance
 - b. To protect city or department business or data
 - c. To investigate a violation of any law, order or directive.
 - d. To assure compliance with this policy.

NOTICE is hereby given that there are no facilities or systems provided by the city or department for sending or receiving private or confidential electronic communications. The system administrator has access to all e-mail and user accounts and will periodically monitor messages as necessary to assure the efficient performance of the system and appropriate use by the assigned users. The City of Lowell and the Lowell Police Department reserve the right to log network use and monitor the file server space utilization by the users and assumes no responsibility or liability for files deleted.

IV. COMPUTER ACCESS FROM PATROL CARS & DISPATCH

- A. Computer use from patrol cars shall be limited to CJIS/LEIN transactions (CORE) and access to the shared records management system. (New World), for the purpose of conducting official police business.
 1. Personnel shall not run a CCH from the patrol car.
 2. Personnel shall not access the Internet from patrol cars.
 3. Personnel will not attempt to enter information while driving.

- B. Message transactions to other cars, departments, stations or persons shall be limited to official police messages as necessary to conduct police business.
 - 1. This type of messaging is permanently recorded and carries with it no expectation of privacy.
 - 2. No inappropriate messages or messages that may be offensive to others will be sent from patrol car computers.
 - 3. All messages sent or received should be considered public record and are subject to release and/or discovery to outside sources such as the media, courts or the public via FOIA requests or subpoena.
- C. When an officer is viewing the squad car laptop, the screen should be facing the officer so that any citizens or prisoners in the back seat cannot view the screen. When an officer leaves the squad car, they shall sign out of the TALON LEIN program or close the screen on the keyboard.
- D. At no time will citizens/non-police officers be allowed in the police station unescorted. When there are citizens in the police station/dispatch area, the TALON LEIN program shall not be visible to the citizens and must be attended by a dispatcher or police officer. If this is not possible, personnel shall log off the TALON LEIN program.

V. CJIS/LEIN

- A. It shall be the policy of the Lowell Police Department to train, advise and test all personnel in the proper use of CJIS/LEIN (CORE) including proper dissemination as well as the consequences for misuse or improper disclosure of LEIN information.
- B. Terminal Agency Coordinator (TAC)
 - 1. The TAC shall be the person responsible and in charge of the security, integrity, accuracy and operation of the Lowell Police Department LEIN system (desktop and mobile computer access).
 - 2. The TAC has staff authority over all personnel who access LEIN using Lowell Police Department equipment.
 - a. The TAC has authority to counsel personnel on use or misuse and for specific violations of this policy.
 - 1. All counseling will be documented and forwarded to the Chief of Police.
 - b. The TAC will bring to the attention of the Chief of Police or his designate specific violations and/or misuse of LEIN that are more serious and may require discipline beyond that of counseling.
- C. LEIN and all information derived through LEIN shall be limited to official law enforcement purposes ONLY.
 - 1. Personnel shall not use, access or disseminate any information obtained through LEIN for personal business, personal use, personal gain or for other non-law enforcement purpose.

2. Personnel shall not disclose any information derived or accessed through LEIN in a manner that is not authorized by law or rule.
 - a. Information obtained via LEIN shall not be disclosed to any unauthorized person. This includes a person calling in requesting to know if they or someone else has a warrant. They must be told that they have to come in to the department with proper identification to find out if they have a warrant.
3. Any printout from LEIN, unless attached to a report, must be shredded, cross-cut. personnel will use the shredder located in the dispatch office. Any personnel violating this by throwing LEIN into a wastebasket, shall be subject to disciplinary action, which may include verbal and/or a written warning other sanctions as determined by the chief of police.
4. Faxing of LEIN/NCIC printouts is only allowed when the receiving fax machine is at an authorized agency and is attended by authorized staff.
5. Criminal History Records will be regulated to comply with the Federal Privacy Act and NCIC guidelines.
6. Any query for a CHR (CCH) will be documented with a complaint number.
7. E-mailing LEIN/NCIC material is strictly prohibited.
8. When a subpoena or FOIA request is received for LEIN/NCIC information, it will be immediately forwarded to the Michigan State Police LEIN Field Services Section for processing. This department shall not release any LEIN upon receipt of a FOIA request or subpoena.
9. A CHR (CCH) taken to the Prosecutor's Office with a request for a warrant will have the name of the prosecutor that the report was given to documented on the case file by the detective or officer taking it in for review.
10. All LEIN attached to a police report pending court hearings, a trial or completion of a police investigation, shall be shredded when the investigation has been closed.

D. Training

1. Lowell Police Department Personnel or other authorized trainers shall train all operators/uses in the use of LEIN. Access will not be allowed unless personnel are trained and tested.
2. All operators will be tested biennially and shall pass with a score of 70% or higher. The TAC will be responsible for administering the test.

E. Misuse of LEIN

1. Violations of LEIN may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination.

- 2. Improper or unauthorized dissemination of LEIN information or accessing LEIN information or accessing LEIN information for personal use or gain is a violation of law. Personnel are subject to criminal prosecution for violations in addition to disciplinary sanctions.
 - a. A first violation is a misdemeanor and is punishable by imprisonment for not more than 93 days or a fine of not more than \$500, or both. A second or subsequent violation is a felony, which is punishable by imprisonment for not more than 4 years or a fine of not more than \$2,000, or both.
 - b. Violation of Department of State, Driver Privacy Protection Act (improper dissemination of use of vehicle and driver's license information) – Felony. (MCL 28.214(6) (a) (b).

VI. COMPLIANCE

Violations of this policy or portions thereof may result in disciplinary action up to and including termination. Violations of the CJIS/LEIN portions of this policy may also include criminal prosecution as outlined in this document.

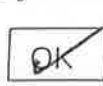

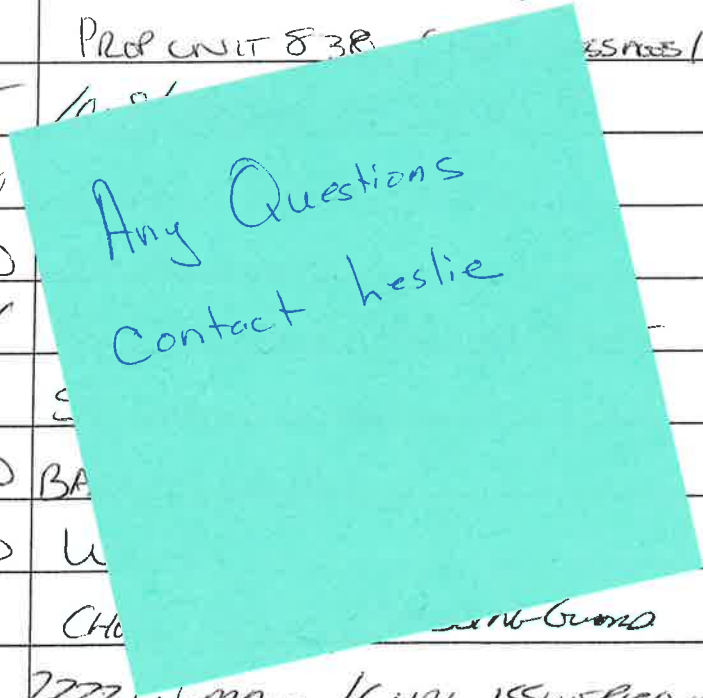

RE: Disciplinary Action Report

After reviewing the criminal investigation report from the Michigan State Police and conducting an employer based personnel investigation for the City of Lowell; I find you in violation of the following guidelines in the City of Lowell Police Department Policy Manual.

- **Policy #1, Chapter #4 Personal Conflict Incidents** – Your involvement in a police matter involving your ex-wife and clear disregard for adhering to this policy.
- **Policy #1, Chapter #4 Conduct Unbecoming of a Police Officer** – Your actions brought disrepute on the Police Department and impaired the efficient operation of it.
- **Policy #1, Chapter #4 Neglect or Inattention to Duty** – During the criminal investigation you stated that you took action for law enforcement purposes. However, no report was ever generated nor did you notify your Superior Officer that you came across your ex-wife in the course of your duty.
- **Policy #8, Chapter #5, Item E – Misuse of LEIN** – You were charged with five misdemeanor counts of Misuse of LEIN. While you have yet to be convicted of any charges in a court of law, the report reflects blatant probable cause that this policy was violated.

While I recognize that you were not Chief of Police at the time of these incidents, you are held to an even higher standard than your police staff. I also recognize that your relationship with your ex-wife is tumultuous and that has caused undue strain to you and your family. While these incidents occurred four to five years ago, I cannot tolerate violations in this regard. I recognize you hold yourself to a higher standard and I appreciate the leadership you have brought to the Police Department. It appears this may have been a lack of judgement due to the trouble in your personal life, but it still cannot be condoned. Until this matter, you have had an impeccable service record and brought a positive image to this Police Department and City. While I believe you will have to reestablish your credibility and integrity along with that of the Police Department, I am confident that in time this can be resurrected.

For those reasons, I will not be dismissing you as Chief of Police. On Wednesday June 14, 2017 you were placed on unpaid administrative leave. In addition, all benefits provided by the City of Lowell were stripped. You are suspended without pay or benefits from your role as Chief of Police for 90 calendar days from that date. If you choose to return, you will be able to do so on Tuesday September 12, 2017, since the court case has been adjudicated. You must also be in compliance with all court directives on this matter.

In addition, any harassment of Julie or Christopher Rees will not be tolerated. If there is evidence presented to me of this occurring through you or any back channel linked to you, which will cause for your immediate dismissal. I recognize they have made unfounded claims in the past, so all complaints will be investigated for their thoroughness before I reach a decision. Please don't put me in a position to do this!

I will also be recommending to LEIN Field Services and the Attorney General's Office that you are not given access to LEIN for one year. In addition, you will no longer serve as Terminal Agency Coordinator. That will be assigned to Detective Van Solkema.

This personnel matter will be placed in a sealed file at City Hall. If this matter is expunged in a Court of Law, this matter will be removed from it.

CITY OF LOWELL CITY MANAGER INVESTIGATION OF CHIEF STEVEN BUKULA

ORIGIN

On Friday April 14, 2017, at approximately 1900 hours, I received a telephone call and then a text message from Mayor Mike DeVore asking that I contact him immediately. I was informed by Mayor DeVore that he received a correspondence from the Michigan State Police LEIN Field Services Unit regarding a complaint pertaining to the possible use of the Law Enforcement Information Network.

INFORMATION

I met Mayor DeVore at his residence on Saturday April 15, 2017 at approximately 1330 hours and received the correspondence. I reviewed the information and confirmed that this was a valid correspondence. The letter indicated that "the complainant alleged Lowell Police Chief Steve Bukala queried his ex-wife and several male acquaintances through LEIN in order to obtain information to use in divorce and custody proceedings."

The letter indicated that LEIN historical records were ordered for the following names: Julie Rees, Julie Schomer, Julie Bukala, Shawn Gravlin and Christopher Rees. In reviewing the matter, I observed there were a number of tasks that the City of Lowell was asked to perform; most importantly, that a thorough investigation of this matter is completed. At that time, I decided that I would contact the Michigan State Police to conduct an investigation.

After speaking with Mayor DeVore, I went to City Attorney Richard A. Wendt's residence and reviewed the information with him. We had a conference call with Mayor DeVore and we decided that Mayor DeVore and I would meet with Chief Bukala at 9:00 AM on Monday April 17, 2017.

On April 17, 2017 at approximately 0800 hours, I contacted the Captain David Roesler, Michigan State Police Sixth District Commander and left a message with him informing him of the correspondence I received from LEIN Field Services. I also asked for the Michigan State Police to conduct the Criminal Investigation of this matter.

At approximately 0900 hours, I went into the police station to ask Chief Bukala to meet with me in the conference room on the second level of City Hall. There Mayor DeVore and I met with him, I presented him the letter and he read it. He first responded by saying, "you have to suspend me!" At that time, I informed him that he would be placed on paid administrative leave. He stated that he doesn't remember anything about this.

He eventually changed into civilian clothes and turned in all keys and credentials. His badge and service weapon were secured. Once that was completed, I drove him home because both Sergeant Christopher Hurst and Detective Scot Van Solkema were interviewing a candidate for a part-time police officer.

Once I drove Bukala to his residence, I went to the Michigan State Police Sixth District Headquarters in Rockford. I met with Captain David Roesler, Insp. Cameron Henke and Lt. Michael Anderson. We discussed the letter that was presented. At that time, they informed me of a complaint made in February by Bukala's ex-wife where she alleged that Chief Bukala may have misused LEIN and ran her name. At that time the complaint was unfounded, and it was unknown why this matter was being reactivated.

I was also informed of a complaint investigated by the Michigan State Police of a complaint by Julie Bukala where she alleged that Steve had a police report of a recent OWI arrest sent to her employer. The complaint was unfounded because they could not determine the suspect and the fact that the report was considered a public document.

On Tuesday April 18, 2017, I was contacted by Detective Sergeant John Forner of the Michigan State Police. He requested necessary items of information to provide him so he could begin the investigation.

Wednesday April 19, 2017, I met with Det./Sgt. Forner at City Hall and he began his investigation.

MICHIGAN STATE POLICE INVESTIGATION

Attached is the report from the Michigan State Police regarding the Criminal Investigation of Chief Bukala.

EMPLOYER INVESTIGATION

On Friday June 9, 2017, I gathered a copy of the police report from the Michigan State Police Freedom of Information Unit. I reviewed the approximate 200 page report. Saturday June 10, 2017, I reviewed the report for several hours and I was concerned about the five LEIN Transmissions that were in question dated below:

- 4/5/12
- 8/27/12
- 2/26/13
- 6/3/13
- 6/8/13

In the instances above Bukala stated he claimed these matters were for law enforcement purposes. Bukala was a Sergeant at the time of all of these occurrences. The report indicates his justifications in each matter. There were also instances where he claimed he passed information onto officers relieving him from his shift.

During the investigation, it should be noted that Bukala provided witnesses who were police officers. Those witnesses were asked hypothetically by Det/Sgt. Forner if they would run their ex-wife in LEIN, in each instance the officer in question said they would not and provided a detailed reason as to why not or how they would handle it.

What was not indicated in the report was if Bukala notified Chief of Police Barry Getzen of the matter. There was no indication that a report was filed on any of these law enforcement purposes.

INTERVIEW WITH MARK HOWE

On Monday June 10, 2017 at approximately 1330 hours, I spoke with former City Manager Mark Howe via telephone. I asked him if during his tenure, he was ever informed by Chief Getzen of any incidents where Bukala may have run his ex-wife in LEIN. He stated he had not. I asked him if he was aware of any incidents where Bukala was involved in investigating any law enforcement matters regarding his ex-wife. Mr. Howe stated he was not.

I asked him if Bukala ever informed him of issues regarding his ex-wife. Mr. Howe informed me that he was getting phone calls from Christopher Rees and Bukala's former mother in law about Chief Bukala being involved in some unscrupulous activities and abusing his authority as a police officer. Mr. Howe informed them that if they had evidence to please provide it and he would give it consideration. No evidence was ever

provided. Mr. Howe also was aware of Facebook postings made on the City Facebook page by Christopher Rees and a Personal Protection Order filed by Steve Bukala against Christopher Rees.

Mr. Howe was aware of issues between Bukala and his ex-wife and gave him indication when he was contacted by Mr. Rees or his ex-wife's mother. Mr. Howe informed me he tried to distance himself on these matters as he believed they were more personal matters than those regarding his position with the City.

INTERVIEW WITH BARRY GETZEN

On Tuesday June 13, 2017 at approximately 1645 hours, I was contacted by former Police Chief Barry Getzen. He was the Chief of Police when all of the LEIN transmissions in question occurred. I asked Mr. Getzen if Bukala ever informed him of receiving possible criminal information regarding his ex-wife. Mr. Getzen stated he did not. I asked him if he was aware of Bukala running LEIN on his ex-wife due or documented any incidents relating to a law enforcement matter with his ex-wife. Mr. Getzen stated that he was not aware of any documented incidents. He further informed me that it would have been a red flag if he did. He informed me that in his former position working for the Michigan State Police that he had fired troopers for misuse of LEIN.

Mr. Getzen informed me that was aware of Bukala's divorce troubles. He stated he only met his ex-wife and daughter one time. He further stated that if information was presented to him regarding running his ex-wife in LEIN this would have given him a greater reason for a red flag.

CONTACT WITH BARRY COUNTY PROSECUTOR

On Wednesday June 14, 2017 at approximately 1100 hours, I was contacted by Barry County Prosecutor Julie Nakfoor Pratt. At the request of Kent County, the Michigan Attorney General's Office assigned the case to Barry County due to a conflict of interest with the Kent County Prosecutor Chris Becker. She informed me that she was issuing five misdemeanor charges against Chief Bukala for misuse of the law enforcement information network. She stated that he will be available to turn himself into Kent County for booking today. However, there were issues with the court as there was also a conflict of interest with the 63rd District Court. So they were awaiting assignment of the court. She informed me that she was going to issue a statement that day regarding the charges.

Immediately after that call, I informed Chief Bukala that the Barry County Prosecutor was going to issue the misdemeanor charges against him. I told him that beginning, this date he would be on unpaid administrative leave. I also informed him that he would be receiving a call from City Attorney Dick Wendt tomorrow for some follow-up questions that I needed addressed.

CITY ATTORNEY INTERVIEW WITH CHIEF BUKALA

At my request, the City Attorney contacted Chief Bukala on Thursday June 15, 2017. He asked Chief Bukala if he ever notified Barry Getzen or Mark Howe that he ran his ex-wife in LEIN for law enforcement purpose. Chief Bukala said that he did not. He was then asked if he ever wrote a police report regarding any law enforcement purposes that he ran his ex-wife in LEIN for. Chief Bukala said he did not.

DISPOSITION

I placed Chief Bukala under unpaid leave and all benefits have been stripped as of this date. He is awaiting an arraignment hearing. This information will be used in disciplinary proceedings regarding this matter.

I, Chief Steven Bukala, am writing to address questions and concerns of the city manager, Mr. Michael T. Burns.

First, I would like to take the opportunity to apologize. I am deeply sorry that my personal life bled into my professional life and caused the police department and community of Lowell embarrassment. Second, I'd also like to apologize for putting you in this position. This has not been good for anyone, not you, the community, myself or my family.


Your first question of concern is how do I envision our relationship once I return to my position as chief of police? Since you took the position as city manager, I've always respected and appreciated our professional relationship. Furthermore, I have always respected the chain of command, I have always followed it and I always will. I do not expect our relationship to change after this outcome. I will not do anything to undermine your position and I'm going to accept whatever punishment you decide because you've been more than fair to me since your arrival and therefore there is no need for me to fear this disciplinary process or behave in such a way that would affect our professional relationship.

The second question of concern, how will you be avoiding conflict with your ex-wife and her current husband to avoid any further incidents that could impact your role as chief of police? The 17th Circuit Court encourages co-parenting, I will continue to co-parent and use the 17th Circuit Court and Friend of the Court for legal matters. Our custody order has a very specific guidelines for parenting time, holidays and issues alike. In June 2017, the 17th Circuit Court appointed a mediator, Ms. Mary Benedict, to assist with any areas of concern or if any problems arise. Furthermore, our daughter is 15 years old and is able to communicate regarding different topics, myself and Ms. Rees have utilized Stephanie for communication purposes and this form of communication has been successful in recent months. Since I took custody, in August 2016, we have utilized the 17th Circuit Court, Friend of the Court and Stephanie to assist in following our court order, and utilizing the legal system for day to day communication, and we have not had any issues arise.

The third question of concern states how will I address credibility issues of the police department when a sensitive police situation arises? I would like to offer a public apology to the community, the City Council, and the police department to give peace of mind that I will not act out in such a way that would affect the department and community again. I cooperated and participated openly and honestly with the Michigan State Police with hopes to minimize any credibility issues for the department. For future issues with the police department that could involve credibility and sensitive situations I plan to follow a checks and balance system and follow the chain of command. I also plan to continue to follow the open door management style, not just with my officers and the public, but between you and I as well to avoid any question of credibility.

Finally, I'm hoping you and I can continue to work together after we make it through this incident and show the community that we are united and we will do what is best for the City of Lowell, now and in the future.






